New Residents for the Rectory

For the next year, the All Saints Parish rectory next door to the church will be home to eight Fellows participating in the Life Together program which is sponsored by the diocese. Life Together is an eleven-month fellowship and leadership development project that matches emerging young leaders (21-35 years of age) with mission-based non-profit organizations and churches throughout Eastern Massachusetts. The Fellows, many of whom come from out of state to participate in the program, live in intentional communities where they share household responsibilities as well as planned spiritual practices. One of these clusters of young adults recently moved into the Rectory and will live there until early July 2013.

When approached by the diocese, who knew that our Rectory would be vacant for at least a year, the All Saints Vestry responded to the proposal with enthusiasm; and we have recently approved a contract regarding these living arrangements. All Saints has always had a cohort of young adults in our midst and we welcome the opportunity to connect with a group of young adults who are exploring ways to consciously incorporate a spiritual dimension into their work and lives.

About This Sunday's Music

We welcome the fine All Saints Choir back from their long summer hiatus. We also welcome the distinguished organist Mark Dirksen to our staff as Associate in Music.

The hymns this week mostly emphasize the theme of praise, but do take a moment to look at the words of Hymn 628, *Help us, O Lord, to learn*, which we will sing just before the Gospel. Its three short verses teach a mini-sermon on some essential reasons we gather together in this community. The other hymns are: 477 – *All praise to thee, for thou, O king divine*; 429 – *I'll praise my Maker while I've breath*; and 376, Beethoven's famous Ode to Joy, *Joyful, joyful, we adore thee.*

The choral works include Hugo Distler's *Lobet den Herren*, a fine setting of an ancient German hymn, which is also found in modern version in our Hymnal at #390, *Praise to the Lord, the Almighty*. At the offertory, Bryan Kelly's jubilant setting of a fine Charles Wesley text, *Rejoice, the Lord is King*, will be sung. And at the communion a motet be Gabriel Fauré, *Tantum ergo*.

Join a Mission Trip to Tanzania and Uganda

Bishop Shaw invites members of the diocese to join him on a mission trip to Tanzania and Uganda in December. The dates will be from December 2-17 with 6 days each on mission in Tanzania and Uganda. Our diocese has had a companion relationship with the Anglican Diocese of Tanga for six years. This relationship has been nurtured and developed by the Friends of Tanzania, a small group of parishioners from All Saints, Brookline, Trinity, Melrose and Grace, North Attleborough. They have raised funds for several projects including the building of a muchneeded health center in the remote mountain village of Kizara. With the expected completion of this health center in the next four months, Bishop Shaw and the group will represent our diocese at its opening by the Bishop of Tanga, the Right Rev. Maimbo Mndolwa. In Uganda, the group will visit the Bishop Masereke Foundation to hear progress on a new hospital supported in part by funds from the Together Now campaign.
